## **Updating Budget Cycle Timeline**

- Synchronize with external funding and MIT fiscal year
  - Deans, Housemasters, GSC, ASA
  - Know granted funding before budgeting major events
- Enhanced officer and SPEC transition
  - New officers observe and make suggestions for creation of Cycle 4 budget but old officers submit
  - New officers make first budget after getting some experience in the position
- Consistent durations and deadlines
  - Easier to plan and iterate with shorter cycles

#### About the Ballot

- 2 versions of ballot: committee chairs and hall councilors
- A valid ballot (for a given race) is one whose only marks are unique positive integers in the range from 1 to n.
  - □ Number "1" is the highest ranking preference.
  - $\square$  "n" is the number of candidates for a position!
- Blank ballots are counted as "no confidence".
- A ballot with invalid characters will be invalidated, removed from the vote, and count against quorum.
- A missing ballot is treated as an abstention and counts against quorum.

### **Voting Instructions**

- Order the candidates according to your preference if multiple candidates for one position: "1", "2", etc.
- Mark only *unique*, *positive* integers in the range from 1 to n, where n is the number of candidates!
- Empty spaces are interpreted as "no confidence"
- Any stray marks or words will invalidate your vote





#### **VP of Resources**

## Hall Councilor Amendment

#### Rationale

- To facilitate the recruitment and transition for the new house government within the timeline given to the community by MIT housing.
- In anticipation that the number of the nominees may be smaller than the open positions.



## Hall Councilor Amendment

Original: Nominations shall open at the <u>April House Council Meeting</u> and close after two weeks.

Proposed change: "Nominations shall open at a House Council Meeting after the election of the executive council and close after two weeks."

Original: The Board of Trustees shall officiate the portion of the Hall Meetings regarding the election. Members of each Hall may cast their votes at their Hall Meeting or during one additional period, to be chosen by the Board of Trustees, falling between the close of nominations and the May House Council Meeting.

Proposed addition: "For hall council elections taking place between March 1st and September 30th 2016, a candidate must be ranked on more than half of the ballots cast in order to receive a hall councilor position in that election."



# SP Equipment and Inventory Policy

#### Summary:

- Dorms MAY borrow our A/V, kitchen, and music equipment after they sign our inventory sharing contract
- Individuals and student groups may not borrow our equipment for events, even if they are at SP
- SP residents may borrow small items for SP events (igroups, SPICE, SPontaneous, etc.). The resident must contact the appropriate SPEC and publicize the event appropriately
